#### **Discussion with BVC:**

- Execs introduced themselves and ran an icebreaker
- Differences between Scouts and Venturers:
  - Vennies does not have patrols but do have temp patrols (project patrols)
  - Their leadership format is chair, vice-chair, exec etc.
  - Much more independent
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Get to meet a lot of branch people, not just within your group
  - Really good social outlet

- ACT Venturer Units:
  - Not a lot of vennie units
  - Try out different units, don't need to be loyal to your scout unit.
  - Some work with younger levels
  - Different vennie units focus on different areas (e.g some are more chill, some are more badgework serious)
    - Southwell is good for badgework quite a few queen scouts
    - Karla Birna does Duke of Ed
  - Les Ex is also opening a vennie unit.
- Venturer activities:
  - 1-2 December Children's Christmas Party, want volunteers 13+ in setting up + logistics
    - Gang show building 15 minute set ( at party)
    - Archery indoor (Message of Peace program, or SIA) also at the party.
  - Citizen science nature map
- Unit Management course
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Youth members have told Branch that they want a unit management course
  - The course would be aligned with VET outcomes
  - Scouts Australia has registered training organisations that can issue certificates.
  - Similar to TAFE, same sort of qualifications, Good for getting jobs
  - Need to be over age of 14, recognition of prior learning (if done before 14, once you reach 14 can receive VET)
  - People who apply to uni with VET get a reduction in their time. E.g Monash Uni takes a year off a Bachelor of Arts degree if you got a VET in business.
  - VET qualifications can go onto year 12 certificate.
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Easy and direct way of doing SIA's  $\;$
  - Daniel is working with youth members to know what to include in course so it can be tailored, so it meets youth needs. Want a few youth to develop curriculum - email <u>daniel.bartlett@scoutsact.com.au</u>
